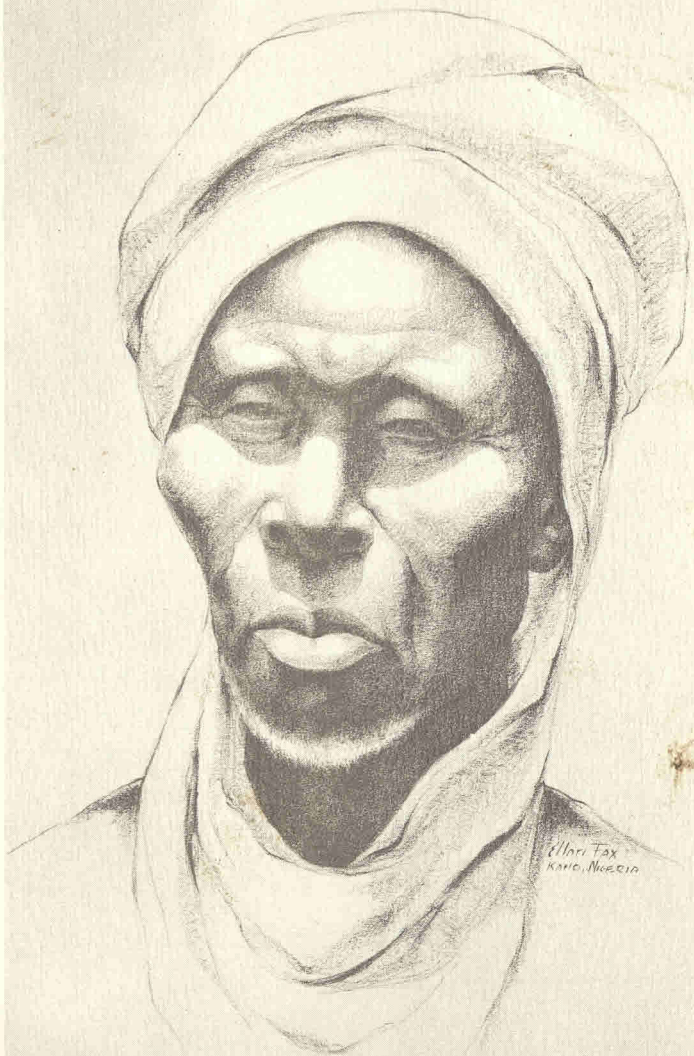

Dear Mrs. Peonidou,


