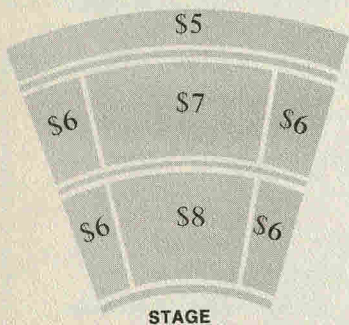


Solon Michaelides

SOLON MICHAELIDES, Conductor. Cyprus-born Solon Michaelides makes his first appearance in the United States as guest-conductor of the Queens Symphony Orchestra. Composer, conductor and musicologist, Dr. Michaelides is the general director of the State Symphony Orchestra of Thessaloniki, Greece. He studied at the Trinity College of Music in London and at the Schola Cantorum and the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris. He conducts regularly in Salonica and Athens, has guest-conducted major orchestras in numerous countries and his symphonic works have been performed in many areas of the world.

Michaelides is the Commander of the Royal Order of Phoenix of Greece, an Honorary Fellow of Trinity College of Music in London, and an Honorary Member of the American Ethnomusicologica Society.
